PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Tech-Support

The HUB portal (hub.acadiau.ca) is the first stop to find answers to questions. The Beveridge Arts Centre (BAC) Service Desk provides an additional level of support and assists with academic application software, laptop problems, printing, and accessing the Acadia network. Acadia is compatible with both Apple and PC products. All students will receive an "acadiau.ca" email, which will be the same as your Acadia Central login.

Office 365

Every student receives a license for Microsoft Office 365, at no additional cost. As of June, Office 365 is available to incoming students.

Purchase a Laptop

All Acadia University students require a laptop. Acadia partners with Apple and Dell, providing several models designed to meet your academic needs. The Technology Services Store (https://ts.acadiau.ca/tech-store.html) provides the specific Acadia pricing, configurations, warranty packages, and customized purchasing. Laptops purchased through Acadia are eligible for warranty and computer serving.

Care 2.0 model, we strive to offer a 30-minute first
appointment within 24-hours to create a plan based on
student concerns and needs. Plans may include individual
or group counselling and/or peer support.



HEALTH AND DENTAL INSURANCE

Eligible students attending Acadia University are automatically enrolled in the Acadia Students' Union Health and Dental Plans. Fees are automatically charged to your student account.

Rates

Canadian Plan (which supplements your provincial health coverage)

Single student, 12 months \$231.00 Family, 12 months* \$535.00

International Plan (for those who do not have provincial health coverage)

Single student, 12 months \$750.00 Family, 12 months* \$1500.00

Dental Plan (Flat Rate)

Single person, 12 months \$165.00 Family*, 12 months \$350.00

*In order to activate family coverage, students register online and provide details of their dependents at www.studentbenefits.ca before September 30.

To opt out: If you are covered under another comparable health plan, you must show a copy of your insurance card from your provider or a letter before the fees associated with the plan can be removed from your account. Acceptable proof of coverage includes an insurance card from your provider or a letter from the insurer or employer providing the coverage. Proof of alternate dental coverage is not required when submitting the opt out request.

You must opt out by September 30, no exceptions. To learn more about your benefits, or to opt out and have the fees removed, visit www.studentbenefits.ca and select "Acadia Students' Union". The opt out portal will open July 1 for students starting in September.




